

BIO: KATHERINE BAICKER

Katherine Baicker is Professor of Health Economics in the Department of Health Policy and Management at the Harvard School of Public Health. She received her BA in economics from Yale in 1993 and her PhD in economics from Harvard in 1998. She is a research associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research. She has served on the faculty of the Economics Department at Dartmouth College, the Center for the Evaluative Clinical Sciences and the Department of Community and Family Medicine at Dartmouth Medical School, and in the Harris School of Public Policy at the University of Chicago. From 2005-2007, Professor Baicker served as a Senate-confirmed Member of the President's Council of Economic Advisers.

Professor Baicker's research interests include health economics, welfare, and public finance, with a particular focus on the financing of health insurance, spending on public programs, and fiscal federalism. Her research has been published in journals such as the *American Economic Review*, *Health Affairs*, the *Journal of Public Economics*, and the *Quarterly Journal of Economics*, and has been featured in the *New York Times*, the *Wall Street Journal*, *Business Week*, and on National Public Radio.
