

**JENNIFER KATES, M.A., M.P.A., Director, HIV Policy, The Kaiser Family Foundation.**

Ms. Kates directs the Foundation's HIV-related policy projects, conducts policy research and analysis, and provides HIV/AIDS expertise to the Foundation's public health information campaigns and media partnerships, including the Foundation's partnership with Viacom (knowHIV/AIDS), and to numerous external stakeholders including the media, policymakers, and community members. Her work focuses on both domestic and global HIV/AIDS policy issues, including issues of health care coverage, financing, access to care, and prevention, particularly for those increasingly affected by the epidemic, and analysis of global and domestic funding for HIV/AIDS.

Prior to joining the Foundation, Ms. Kates was a Senior Associate with The Lewin Group, where she focused on HIV/AIDS policy, strategic planning/health systems analysis, and health care for vulnerable populations. She provided consulting services to clients such as the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the New York State AIDS Institute, the Texas Department of Health, the New York City Department of Public Health, the Whitman Walker Clinic, and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. Before that, Ms. Kates was the Director of the Office of Lesbian, Gay, and Bisexual Concerns at Princeton University, where she was also the Coordinator of the University's Alcohol and Other Drugs Peer Education Program. She has been involved in HIV/AIDS issues at the community and national levels for 15 years.

Ms. Kates holds a Bachelors Degree in Political Science and Women's Studies from Dartmouth College, a Masters Degree in Political Science from the University of Massachusetts, and a Masters Degree in Public Affairs, with a concentration in Demography, from Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs.
